### *Goodbye to families and first session campers!*

We would like to share a few thoughts about staying within the camp spirit over Show Weekend. The weekend is a special time for everyone, and we ask that you help us to maintain the intentional community we have built over the summer.

**Food & treats:** In spite of what your daughters may tell you, it is not a tradition to bring a cooler of soda and five pounds of candy for her and her friends! It is certainly fine to bring some extra goodies from home, but we would love to avoid a culture of extreme excess that can sometimes accompany this specialness. Feel free to bring what they can eat when they are with you; extra candy and food may not be taken back to the units as we do not want to attract critters. Please remember that we are a nut-free campus.

**Cell phones:** We try very hard to maintain a natural and simple environment in which your daughters are learning the values of personal rather than technological interaction, the pleasure of releasing themselves from the demands of "instant communication," and the tremendous growth that comes with separating from familiar and perhaps too-convenient ways of connecting with family and friends. We ask that when you come to Aloha for Show Weekend, you put your cell phones away for the time you are here and, most especially, that you do not interrupt the energy of your daughter's experience by having the cell phone be a part of your weekend together. If you really want to understand the environment your daughter has experienced, please help us maintain a campus without the electronic noises, loud voices, and unpleasant interruptions that can accompany cell phone use. The one area where cell phones would be appropriate is if you are using it as your camera for the weekend. We hope you will join us in making sure that the sounds you hear at camp are those of children laughing, birds singing, canoe paddles hitting the water, and the breeze in the trees. Thank you ahead of time.

**Leaving camp property:** Campers may sign out to go with their families to visit siblings at Lanakila or Hive, especially Saturday 10-4 and Sunday 10-2. To visit Lanakila or Hive with another family requires parental permission and must be arranged in advance. Please keep the girls in camp spirit by limiting trips only to our other camps.

### **Swim Check & Boating Procedures**

- Swim Check:** We require a swim check for deep water swimming (Swim two laps, tread water for 2 minutes). Visitors who are unable to complete this test may swim in the shallow area, but may not go into deep water.
- Boating:** You may use the boats and canoes in the boating area, but a Personal Floatation Device (PFD) must be worn at all times.
- Sailing:** Visitors may sail after successfully completing the Swim Check and only with a sailing department member aboard. Everyone must wear a PFD.
