
BUILDING COMMUNITY






Completion of two of the most pressing projects on our list at Aloha and Hive will foster and strengthen community.

ALOHA





At Aloha, we are building two gorgeous meeting spaces on the hillside modeled after Club Shack. One of these new buildings will be near Seventh Heaven (formerly Unit II), while the other will be next to Old Hideaway (formerly Unit V). They will be rustic and beautiful with log railings, vaulted ceilings, I5-panel glass doors, and traditional siding. Our aim is that they fit seamlessly with the campus's prevailing design aesthetic while providing much-needed program space, particularly in inclement weather and outside of department time.

The buildings' footprints will be 24'x32' which should allow up to 45-50 people to assemble for games, activities, reflection, or simply enjoying one another's company. Not only will the structures serve as programmatic assets, they will also play the critical function of providing a safe, secure gathering space in the event of severe storms or emergency. We believe they are also important additions in bringing greater equity to the physical plants across our campuses.






At Hive, we are renovating the counselor gathering space known as "Shaw Shack." This will involve moving interior partitions to create a more usable technology room and defined lounge area; sanding and painting all the floors; building counter space with a sink; resurfacing all the walls with pine paneling; updating the bathrooms; and resurfacing existing ceilings with shiplap pine boards. We will also install traditional lighting in all rooms and on the front porch. Utilitarian areas will be disguised with small partitions and access panels.

Summer staff pour their hearts into the work of nurturing and caring for the young people in their care. Enhancing this space so it is both comfortable and beautiful is an important step towards providing our counselors with an inviting and convenient place to recharge and socialize with peers. Additionally, it will be a functional space for counselors to store their valuables and to take care of personal matters unrelated to camp, such as registering for classes nd talking to their families.

BUDGET

The combined estimate for these two projects is \$200,000 and includes design, materials, and labor. We are working with an independent architect on design; Aloha's talented Buildings & Grounds staff will do much of the construction. All funds raised will be directed toward these projects and other campus improvements at Hive and Aloha.

RECOGNITION

Individuals who contribute \$2,500 or more—or groups that raise \$10,000 or more—will be recognized on name boards or signage at Hive or Aloha. Groups can be defined in different ways, for example, former Hive campers from the 1980s, Clubbers from the 1990s, or Aloha counselors.
