Horizons Day Camp

Summer day camp for K-7th grade graduates

At Horizons, every new day brings discovery, learning and fun. With over 150 acres of lakeside woodlands and 11 departments featuring dozens of activities to explore, there is no end to the possibilities for adventure, skills development and just being a kid.

In 2023, 444 young people from K-7th grade got a chance to experience a different activity each day, or hone their skills at their very favorites. Our offerings include sailing, archery, arts & crafts, theater, tennis, and so much more! Your support keeps us able to provide great quality programs, well-trained staff, and top-tier equipment.

Hulbert Outdoor Center

Year-round programs for schools, educators, professionals, & families

Hulbert had a great year in 2023. We were proud that our programs boast a high return rate, and that 21 new school groups decided to join us. Adding to our numbers, we welcome two new schools to the Success Leadership Program, where young people ages 14-18 learn the skills they will need to effectively take a leadership role as young adults in their community.

Nine of the 21 new schools and 355 students were helped by the Aloha Foundation's School Program Endowment. As a result, Hulbert served a total of 100 school groups and over 2,900 students in 2023.





There are kids that return from the Hulbert trip, who present as more confident, more positive, and more resilient because of the various experiences during their time at HOC. Likewise, the class as a whole has also become closer, aiding the dynamic between friends and within the group.

In 2023 Aloha enrolled 144 campers. Not one of them brought a cell phone or device. Incredible in this era, to think that teenage girls would volunteer to spend seven weeks out in nature without social media, unless it was a reality TV contest!

"By unplugging from screens and immersing themselves in nature, teenagers can cultivate resilience, self-confidence, and authentic connections with their peers," observes Aloha director Charlotte Messervy.



With gratitude for all of you who rose to the challenge and helped us to add a covered porch area to the Lanakila dining hall—we couldn't be happier to start the 2024 camp year with a new outdoor seating area. In the words of the man who personifies Lanakila for over a decade, Camp Director Bryan Partridge, "In a world filled with uncertainty and ambiguity, camp creates the conditions where the concept of choice provides the compass to figuring out how campers want to interact with the world. Within these choices lies the discovery of endless potential." 243 campers joined us at Lanakila in 2023.

The Aloha Foundation has perfected forming a community where children feel free to be their true selves without fear of judgement. My son felt it during his time at Lanakila and my daughter feels it at Aloha. This type of community is so incredibly rare.

In 2023, we welcomed 772 participants to our family camp, including spaces for more than 100 from military families. The return of our Memorial Day weekend session attracted 65 family campers, introducing many families to Ohana for the first time. These programs offer families a chance to escape their daily stresses and digital distractions, fostering adventure and connection in our serene environment. Additionally, Ohana hosted over 1,200 guests for weddings and retreats, providing valuable opportunities for learning, reflection, and celebration.





\$1.6 million given to support Endowment & Restricted Funds


The Aloha Foundation Endowment Funds are permanently invested with only the earnings or a small percentage of the principal used annually according to a formula established by the board of trustees.

Our endowment provides a stable, long-term income source, ensuring ongoing support for the Aloha Foundation's mission and programs. Restricted gifts are sometimes given in the form of an endowment—a large sum which is invested with annual distributions from earnings—and sometimes given for a specific purpose, such as a building project or camperships.



2023 Initiatives & Highlights

Prioritizing Wellness

Starting in 2023, we hired a Wellness Coordinator to support campers and counselors. The Wellness Coordinator provides trainings during pre-camp, and supports needs that arise at all of our camps throughout the summer.

Facilities & Campuses

The Buildings & Grounds team continued to keep our campuses looking beautiful. Some projects in 2023 included New porch extension for Horizon's Arts and Crafts building, new clubhouse for Old Hideaway at Aloha. improvements at Hive's office, and Lanakila's Main House renovation project which included renovating the dining hall with the addition of a large covered porch and refurbishing the counselor space.



Choosing Curiosity

In 2023, we launched our organization-wide theme: Choosing Curiosity. We talked about actively choosing to be curious when we might otherwise make assumptions and being open to new possibilities. We encouraged campers, counselors, and staff to get curious, dig in, ask questions, try and even fail at new things.

Staff Training

During pre-camp for our camps this year, we had TQAMP (Formerly Transplaining for Camps) come out and give our staff a comprehensive training session.

The goal was to help staff understand the foundational principles of inclusion and equip them with the tools needed to build and participate in a safe and accepting camp environment where campers of all different identities feel like they belong.



2023 Lanakila Reunion

In August, we welcomed over 400 former Lanakila campers, counselors, and their families back to Fairlee to connect and celebrate 100 years of Lanakila. In honor of the reunion, 180 donors contributed over \$230,000 towards the renovation of Lanakila's Main House.
