### **Position Summary**

The Hulbert Outdoor Center (HOC) Director is responsible for overseeing the overall operations and management of the Aloha Foundation's Hulbert Outdoor Center, ensuring a high standard of programming, facilities, and staff performance in alignment with our mission and values. As a member of the Senior Leadership Team, the HOC Director collaborates closely with Aloha Foundation colleagues to further the organization's mission and strategic goals, and uphold our values.

### **Key Responsibilities:**

Program Leadership & Development:

- Lead the planning, development, and implementation of HOC experiential and educational programs and trainings, including Success Leadership programs, environmental education, team-building, and outdoor adventure courses.
- Ensure that programs are aligned with the Aloha Foundation's mission and values, including community building, self-discovery, and leadership development.
- Grow HOC through assessment and innovation to meet needs and goals of the program, keep the budget balanced and program impact high.

**Risk Management & Operations** 

- Oversee risk management protocols, ensuring that programming and activities adhere to established safety standards, policies, and regulations.
- Manage Challenge Course operations, ensuring that all safety measures and regulatory requirements are met.
- Develop and manage the annual budget for HOC, ensuring effective allocation of resources and meeting financial goals.
- Maintain a focus on participant well-being, ensuring both physical and mental safety across all activities.

Staff Management & Development:

- Recruit, hire, train, manage, and regularly observe HOC staff, ensuring high levels of performance, safety, and engagement.
- Cultivate a positive, inclusive work environment that emphasizes collaboration, accountability, safety, and professional development.



• Ensure all staff are adequately trained in safety, risk management, and emergency protocols.

Community Engagement & Partnership Building:

- Cultivate strong relationships with schools, organizations, and community groups to promote HOC's offerings and increase participation.
- Represent the Aloha Foundation at community, regional, and national events to strengthen the Foundation's presence and network.
- Build partnerships with local organizations to enhance programmatic offerings and support the Foundation's mission.

Reporting & Evaluation:

- Prepare regular reports on program outcomes, financial status, and staff performance.
- Collect and analyze participant and staff feedback to refine and improve programming.
- Use data-driven insights for long-term planning, resource allocation, and program development.
